

ORIOLE BIRDING TRIP REPORT UGANDA JULY 2017

15 Days Uganda Birding Trip

Duration: July 1st, 2017 – July 15th, 2017

Scope: To have a glance at Uganda's bird species including the sought after Shoebill and any other wildlife specialities.

Species Seen: 429 birds, 43 Mammals, 6 Reptiles and over 100 butterflies

Route: Map needed if possible

INTRODUCTION

The Uganda Birding trip lasted for 15 days and started on the 1st July 2017 to 15th July 2017. It covered most of Uganda's best birding spots especially the Albertine Rift valley area. It all started from Entebbe International Airport with a pick up at around 16 hours and an evening birding session in the Entebbe Botanical Gardens. Protected areas visited include; Murchison Falls National Park, Budongo Natural Forest Reserve, Kibale National Park, Queen Elizabeth National Park, Bwindi Impenetrable Forest National Park and Lake Mburo National Park.

Uganda is potentially one of the richest birding destinations in Africa with not only 1078 bird species but also an amazing diversity of fauna inhabiting the thick tropical rain forests and the wide savannas of East Africa. In 15 days, we were able to see 429 birds, 41 Mammals, 6 Reptiles and over 100 butterflies among others. Also remarkable experiences included the Chimpanzee (man's closest cousin) tracking, looking in the eyes of the biggest primates on earth (the gentle Mountain Gorillas), sighting the African Lion, Leopard, Spotted Hyenas and a Side striped Jackal among others.

Iconic birds in the trip included the Majestic Shoebill, Grey crowned cranes (Uganda's National Bird), Black-bellied and Denham's Bustards, Northern and Southern Carmine, Swallow tailed, Cinnamon chested and Black Bee-eaters, Dwarf, Chocolate backed and Giant Kingfishers, Red throated Wryneck, Brown chested Lapwing, Equatorial Akalat, Lesser Jacana, Rameron and White naped Pigeons, Black-billed Turaco, Senegal Coucal, Verreaux's Eagle Owl, Pennant winged, Freckled and square tailed Nightjars, Narina and Bar tailed Trogons, Sabine's Spinetail, White thighed Hornbill, Yellow spotted and Red faced Barbets, Tullberg's and Elliot's Woodpeckers, Lanner Falcon, Ituri Batis, Many colored, Gray-green and Luehder's Bushshrikes, Gray, Black, Petit's, Red-shouldered Cuckooshrikes, Stripe breasted Tit, Little Rush and White

winged Swamp Warblers, Black throated, Chestnut throated and Buff throated Apalis among others.

Special thanks to Mr. Herbert Byaruhanga of Bird Uganda Safaris who offered to train me as a Professional Birder and Tourist Guide.

Program:

Day 1 – July 1st, 2017: Arrival in Entebbe, Transfer & check-in, Birding Entebbe Botanical Gardens. Situated on the northern shores of Lake Victoria, the Botanical Gardens are virtually on the Equator. Overnight Entebbe Travellers Inn (1 night), ideal located little town hotel, close to the airport & in walking distance to The Botanical Gardens passing by the "Victoria Mall". Birds seen include; Lead colored Flycatcher, African Thrush, Grey Woodpecker, Black-and-white casqued, African Pied and Crowned Hornbills, Ross's and Great Blue Turacos., Winding Cisticola, Red-eyed Dove, Common Bulbul, Woodland, Grey headed and Pied Kingfisher, Blackheaded, Slender-billed, Viillot's Black and Village Weavers, Tambourine Dove, African Harrier-Hawk, Scarlet chested, Red chested, Collared and Green throated Sunbirds, Eastern Plantain-Eater, Little Egret, Klaas's and African Emerald Cuckoos among others.

Day 2 – July 2nd, 2017: Early morning birding to Mabamba Wetlands (50km west of Entebbe) on the shores of Lake Victoria by paddling boat for the mighty Shoebill. Birds seen include; Shoebill, Swamp Flycatcher, African Jaçana, Longtoed Lapwing, Malachite Kingfisher, Bluebreasted Bee-eater, Papyrus Gonolek, Yellow billed Duck, Egyptian Geese, African Openbill, Long tailed Cormorant, Harmerkop, Gray, Black headed, Purple and Squacco Herons.

Later in the Afternoon we visited Mpanga Eco-tourism Site for some forest inhabitants. It is situated in Mpigi District, about 35km out of Kampala. Unfortunately forest birding was a bit challenging especially seeing the birds in the top canopy but fortunate enough a lot of them were calling and the 453-hectare Mpanga Forest offered the following species. Red-chested Cuckoo, Grey headed and White breasted Nigrita, Green Hylia, African Emerald Cuckoo and many beautiful butterflies like the Blue Sailor, Mocker and Green banded Swallowtails. Overnight at Kolping Hotel Bwaise

Day 3 – July 3rd, 2017: Birding along the Kampala-Gulu Highway to Murchison Falls National Park. We had a health stop over at Kabalega Diner and a Lunch break at Masindi Hotel where we proceeded to the Northern part of the Park through Kanio-Pabide and overnighed at Pakuba Lodge. Many bird species were seen and they include: Wahlberg's Eagle, Long crested Eagle, Brown and Banded Snake-Eagles, Lizard Buzzard, Gray Kestrel, Sulphur breasted Bushshrike,

Red shouldered Cuckooshrike, Brown throated Wattle-eye, Golden breasted Bunting, Dark Chanting Goshawk, Beautiful Sunbird, Blue naped Mousebird, and African Paradise Flycatcher among others.

Day 4 – July 4th, 2017: Early morning start. Game drive in the Park, savanna grasslands provided swarms of hungry birds. Heading back after dawn. Bar-breasted Firefinch, Speckle-fronted Weaver, Rattling Cisticola, Zitting Cisticola, Silverbird, Northern Carmine Bee-eater, Red-billed Quelea, Mourning collared Dove, Grey Kestrel, Marabou Stork, Yellow-throated Longclaw, Abyssinian Ground-Hornbill, Swallow-tailed and Northern Carmine Bee-eaters, Grey-crowned Crane, Grey-headed Kingfisher, Speckled and Blue naped Mousebirds, Green Woodhoopoe, African Gray Hornbill, Striped Kingfisher, Spot flanked and Black billed Barbet, African Gray, Nubian and Cardinal Woodpeckers, Spotted Morning-Thrush, Sooty Chat and many others.

Boat trip up the stream to observe the Murchison Falls from the bottom. Getting to the starting point was challenging because of the huge amount of distracting fauna along the road. Boat rewards included; Rock Pratincole, Senegal Thick-Knee, Grosbeak Weaver, Lesser Jacana, Goliath Heron, White faced Whistling and Comb Ducks among others. Riverbank wildlife included; Patas Monkey, Oribi, Lelwel Hartebeest, African Buffalo, Red-headed Rock Agama, Warthog, Western striped Ground-Squirrel, Elephants, Uganda Kob, Crocodiles, Nile Bushbuck, Nile Monitor Lizards, Hippos, Ground Pangolin and others

Day 5- July 5th, 2017: After an early morning breakfast, we set off for a game drive on our way out of the park to Masindi and an array of birds and mammals was still available for viewing. The species seen include; Nile Bushbuck, Rothschild Giraffe, Oribi, Uganda Kob and others. Birds seen include; the Northern and Southern Carmine Bee-eaters, Swallow tailed Bee eaters, Green Hoopoe, White browed Sparrow Weavers, Shoebill, Senegal Coucal and Black billed wood-dove among others. Outside Kanio-Pabide, we were treated with big colonies of Vieillot's Black, Grosbeak and Compact Weavers, Black and Northern Red Bishops, Red Collared and Yellow Shouldered Widowbirds, Moustached Grass Warbler etc. Overnight at one of Uganda's oldest hotels- Masindi Hotel

Day 6 – July 6th 2017: After breakfast, we birded towards Budongo Forest (the largest natural forest in East Africa) at the Royal Mile- Uganda's historically known leisure spot for the traditional King of Bunyoro where birding took a full day. Many special birds were seen including; Ituri Batis, Chestnut capped Flycatcher, Little Grey Greenbul, Sooty Flycatcher, Grey-throated Tit-Flycatcher, Redheaded Malimbe, African Emerald Cuckoo, Crested Guineafowl, White spotted Flufftail, White-thighed and Black-and-white Casqued Hornbill, Cassin's and Crowned Hawk Eagle, Black Goshawk, Dwarf and Chocolate backed Kingfishers among others. Primates included the Guereza Colobus, Red tailed and Blue Monkeys. Overnight Masindi Hotel

Day 7 – July 07th 2017: Birding through the Hoima- Kyenjojo road and Fort Portal to Kibale Forest National Park-the world's capital for primates and a chimpanzee tracking destination in

East Africa. Several stop overs were made along the way to capture rare birds like the White winged Swamp Warbler. Primates seen along the way include; Blue, Vervet, and Guereza Colobus Monkeys, as well as Olive Baboons. More bird species were; Overnight at Kibale Guest Cottages (2nights)

Day 8 – July 08th 2017: Chimpanzee Tracking was the main activity for the day after an early Morning breakfast. The whole morning was spent in this activity and after a quick rest; we did birding along the main road. Forest inhabitants like the White breasted Nigrita were also seen.

Day 9 – July 09th 2017: Birdwatching all day via Kasese to Queen Elizabeth National Park (second largest national park in Uganda) and overnight along the Kichwamba Escarpment on Enganzi Game Lodge (2Nights). Species seen include Double-toothed Barbet, Augur Buzzard, Arrow marked and Black lored Babbler, Common Scimitarbill, Laughing and Tambourine Doves, Speckled and Blue naped Mousebirds among others.

Day 10 – July 10th 2017: Morning game Drive around the park for more birds and mammals and a very rewarding afternoon Launch cruise, starting from Mweya peninsula on the Kazinga channel with bathing elephants, Kingfishers flying around and stunning couples of the African Fish Eagles all there. Slender-billed weaver, African Spoonbill, Hamerkop, Black-winged Stilt, Yellowbilled Stork, Grey Heron, Red-necked Francolin, Pied Kingfisher, Blue-spotted Wood-Dove, Madagascar Bee-eater, Woodland Kingfisher, African White-backed Vulture, Wattled, Senegal and Crowned Lapwing, Black-bellied Bustard, Rufous-napped Lark, Pink backed Pelicans, Great and Long-tailed Cormorants etc. Herds of Elephants, Nile monitor, Warthog, Nile Crocodiles, African Lion and Cape Buffaloes among others were also seen.

Day 11 – July 11th 2017: Birding through the Ishaka-Rukungiri Highway to Bwindi Impenetrable National Park. We also birded around the park headquarters and Overnight in Buhoma at Ride 4 a Woman. Birds seen include the Red throated Wryneck, Mackinnon's Fiscal, Dusky brown and Dusky blue Flycatcher, Cinnamon chested Bee-Eater, African Hobby, Pink footed Puffback among others.

Day 12 – July 12th, 2017: Birding along the Mail trail for the full day. This was a very productive birding session with more than 80 species including; White tailed Blue Flycatcher, Baglaffehtand Brown Capped Weavers, Blue-throated Brown, Collared, Green-headed, and Northern Double Collared Sunbirds, Speckled Mousebird, Black Bee-eater, Yellow spotted Barbet, Brown-throated Wattle-eye, Equatorial Akalat, , Bar-tailed Trogon, Grey winged Robinchat, Luehder's, Grey-green and Many colored Bushshrikes among others.

Day 13 – July 13th 2017: Mountain Gorilla Tracking Experience. This was done in the eastern part of the park in Ruhija where a few Albertine Rift valley endemics like the Yellow eyed Black Flycatcher and Regal Sunbird were picked. Also a group of ten Gorilla members with a three months baby was amazing.

Day 14 –July 14th 2017: Leaving Bwindi Impenetrable National Park with to terraced fields in Ruhija. Birding via Kabale, Ntungamo and Mbarara to Lake Mburo National Park-the only national park that contains an entire lake, with Akagera type of vegetation. We reached in the evening and overnighted at Rwakobo Rock Lodge. Wildlife sightings include; Sacred Ibis, Black-crowned Waxbill, Village Weaver, African Stonechat, Fan-tailed Widowbird, Black-lored Babbler, Crested Francolin, Yellow-billed Oxpecker, Greater Blue-eared Starling, Emerald-spotted Wood-Dove, African Grey Hornbill, Rüppell's long-tailed Starling, Spot-flanked Barbet, White-winged Black-Tit, Broad-billed Roller, Flappet Lark, Common Scimitar Bill, Impalas, Vervet Monkeys, Nile Bushbuck.

Day 15– July 17, 2015: Morning boat cruise on Lake Mburo and a full day Game drive around the park in search of the African Finfoot, African Fish-Eagle, Swamp Flycatcher, Black-crowned Night-Heron, Malachite Kingfisher, Red faced Barbet, Yellow-throated Greenbul, Brown chested, Senegal and Wattled Lapwings, among others. Mammals seen include; Zebras, Topi, Impala, Leopard, Eland, Giraffes and others.

Day 16–July 16th 2017: Birding along the Kampala-Masaka Highway on our way back to Entebbe & Departure. A few birds seen include Grey-backed Fiscal, Grey crowned Crane, Long crested Eagle, African Openbill among others.
